

Wyoming COVID-19 Transmission Indicators

December 2020

These color-coded indicators measure statewide and countywide levels of COVID-19 transmission, and are based on indicators developed by the White House COVID-19 Task Force. These indicators are being considered with regard to statewide public health orders and when counties request more or less restrictive variances. In general, less restrictive variances will only be considered for counties maintaining low levels of transmission (Light Green or Dark Green Zones) for at least a two-week period. While these indicators serve as guidelines, other epidemiological factors such as hospital capacity will also be taken into account.

Indicators are calculated based on the prior 14 days. Counties must maintain an adequate testing volume of at least 2,000 tests per 100,000 population over the prior 14 days to be considered for a less restrictive variance.

<p><u>Dark Red Zone: Very High Transmission Levels</u> ≥1,000 cases per 100,000 population AND ≥ 20% test positivity over previous 14 days OR ≥2,000 cases per 100,000 population over previous 14 days</p>
<p><u>Red Zone: High Transmission Levels</u> 202-999 cases per 100,000 population AND 10.1% to 19.9% test positivity over previous 14 days OR ≥500 cases per 100,000 population over previous 14 days</p>
<p><u>Orange Zone: Moderate-High Transmission Levels</u> 101-201 cases per 100,000 population AND 8.0% to 10.0% test positivity over previous 14 days OR Meeting one but not both criteria for incidence or test positivity rate for Red Zone</p>
<p><u>Yellow Zone: Moderate Transmission Levels</u> 20-100 cases per 100,000 population AND 5.0% to 7.9% test positivity over previous 14 days OR Meeting one but not both criteria for incidence or test positivity rate for Orange Zone OR Any active skilled nursing facility or assisted living facility outbreak (multiple residents with COVID-19)</p>
<p><u>Light Green Zone: Low Transmission Levels</u> 9-19 cases per 100,000 population AND 3.0% to 4.9% over previous 14 days OR Meeting one but not both criteria for incidence or test positivity rate for Yellow Zone OR 6 to 10 active cases with no skilled nursing facility or assisted living facility outbreaks</p>
<p><u>Dark Green Zone: Lowest Transmission Levels</u> ≤8 cases per 100,000 population AND <3% test positivity rate over previous 14 days OR 5 or fewer active cases with no skilled nursing facility or assisted living facility outbreaks</p>
